2024 NAIGC Financials

The NAIGC is a 501(c)(3) organization that...

- Is entirely **volunteer run**
- Still has **annual overhead costs**, including:
 - Annual board meeting expenses
 - Website, technology tools
 - Banking and payment fees
 - Outreach and marketing
- Uses its net **income to provide new opportunities and services** for our membership, such as:
 - Trampoline and tumbling at Nationals
 - Possible expansion to Acrobatic Gymnastics
 - Awards, insurance, registration, and scoring for sanctioned/virtual meets and virtual challenges
 - Subsidizing nationals



2024 NAIGC Financials

Income Key Takeaways

- First year where growth and attendance did not seem to still be impacted by COVID
- Adjusted fee structure allowed us to start recovering from multiple years in the red (2021 and 2022)
- No fee changes for 2024-2025 season over previous year
- The Board has an increased focus on their fiduciary responsibility, to help diversify NAIGC income sources over time

Expenses Key Takeaways

- Have started tracking expenses differently to be in compliance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), which accounts for large variances within categories from 2023 to 2024
- Outlay of expenses for Nationals begins 24 months in advance due to deposits required by convention centers
- Retained income is targeted to allow NAIGC to withstand future downturns due to pandemics, disasters, inflation, and general rising cost of doing business and expanding service offerings over the next 5 years

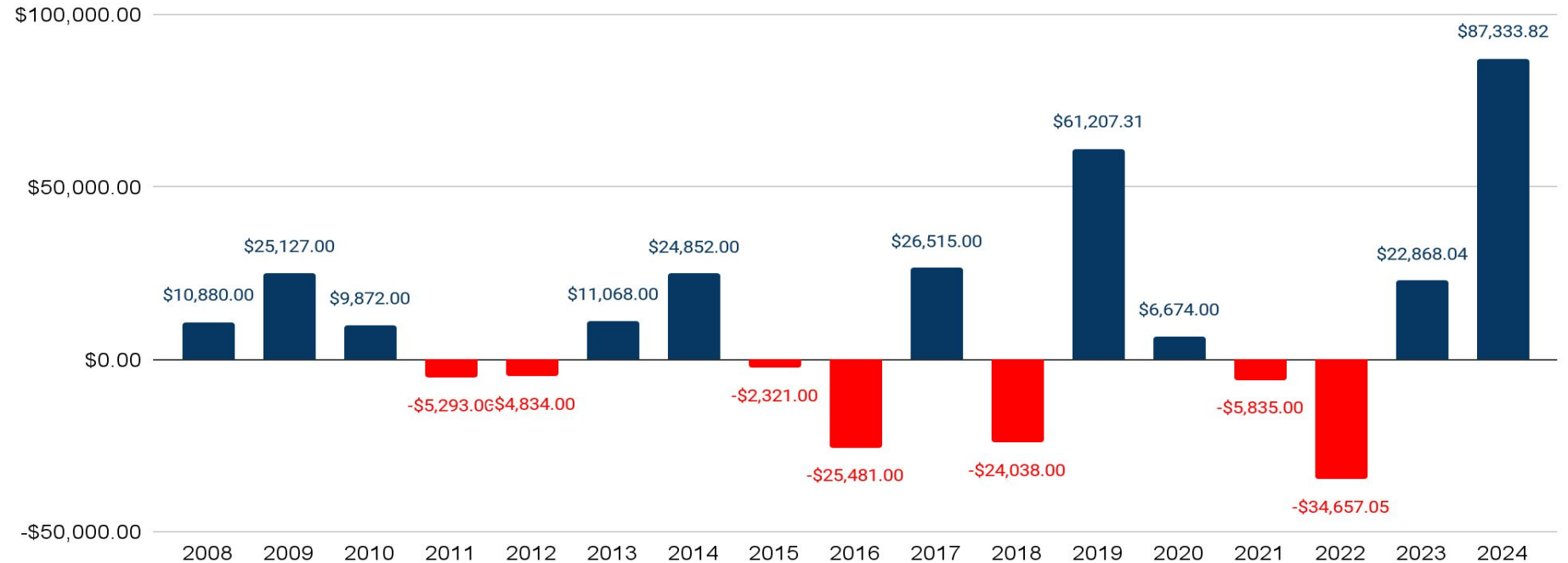

WAG Rules Questions - Page 1

Will no longer be the option to do level 8? Correct. Instead, there is an option to compete Xcel Diamond.

Will both Level 9 AND the open code be offered at Nationals? And if it is a trial, will there still be finals, medals, etc offered? Yes, Level 9 and Open Scoring will be offered at Nationals. There will be medals for both Open and Level 9, however finals offerings will be based on registration numbers. Right now the tentative plan would be to offer finals for Level 9 as long as they have at least 40% of the combined registration for Level 9/Open, which gives a slight preference toward keeping the existing Level 9 with finals. These numbers will be based on the regular registration deadline and will be announced prior to registration closing. This way so athletes will have the opportunity to switch between 9/Open if the option of finals is very important to them. This is also subject to change if numbers come out wildly different than we expect.

For the open ended code - will this be offered during the virtual meets so people can figure out routine construction? We will explore offering this for virtual meets, but you can always ask questions for the rules team about routine construction at rules@naigc.org.

Will the open ended code be offered as a decathlon podium at Nationals? Athletes competing open will still be eligible for decathlon, since decathlon is based on prelims.

WAG Rules Questions - Page 2

(44:40) When does the Level 8 and Xcel Diamond swap take place? - All sanctioned meets in the new year will use the new levels. For any fall meets we will be working with the sanctioning team on a case by case basis. However, clubs will be encouraged to use the new levels if possible.

Will the open scoring level follow the same skill ratings as FIG or have slightly modified skill values like in T&T? Will skill values be capped at E or go up to, for example, H/I/J? We will be using the USAG/Xcel Skill values for the open scoring level, so it will be the A-E system. We will NOT be using FIG values.

(56:06) Do you think it will be an issue with too large of a group doing xcel diamond since the gap is large between diamond and 9? We are aware that this is a possibility. We are taking steps to mitigate that which includes offering the Open Scoring level which should be very flexible allowing for a wide range of athlete levels. While we do expect a large number of existing Level 8's to stay in Xcel Diamond, we also anticipate some percentage moving up to Level 9. Also, Xcel Diamond may be a better bridge to 9 because the maximum potential difficulty for Diamond is actually higher than 8.

(58:52) Are USAG judges able to judge open level or would we have to find a separate judge(s) to judge if we offered open level? Judges should be able to judge the open level. We designed this level to use the existing Xcel Sapphire execution deductions, so the E-score part of judging will remain unchanged. We are also creating online calculators and worksheets for judges to help with the D-score calculation. However, we acknowledge that this is a new level that will take some time to get judges on board which is part of why we are only offering it at Nationals. We don't want to require meet hosts to find judges comfortable with judging a brand new level without guidance. We did however survey judges and many seemed very interested in this prospective level.

Where can we find the list of all A/B/C skills for all the levels? Unfortunately for legal reasons we are unable to provide comprehensive lists of all skills. We will provide resources in the coming months with some common options, but for all the skills, you will need to purchase the USAG code of points.



T&T Rules Questions

Can your synchronized trampoline partner be from a different team than you? Yes, Synchro Tramp partners are not restricted by club or gender.



ScoreFlippers Questions

Will we be able to change our club affiliation from meet to meet or is that still user unfriendly? You can now change your club affiliation yourself ([see video tutorial here](#)). But when you register for a meet, it will lock your club for that meet. So if you change it in INSIGHT after registering for the meet, it WILL NOT change in the meet registration.

If we check the box to allow members to register themselves for meets, will managers still be able to register members, or will members always have to register themselves? Club managers can always register team members no matter what is checked.

When I register and pay for my team do we also have to register and pay as individuals? Yes, every individual needs an athlete membership with the NAIGC.

When should we pay the club membership fee for our team? Before you register for your first sanction competition.



Sanctioning Questions

Could you explain more about how sanctioning an event with NAIGC will help us obtain insurance? The NAIGC carries an organizational insurance policy that we are able to add date-specific event certificates of insurance to if the event is being sanctioned. To do this, you just request an insurance certificate when you submit your sanction and then we obtain the insurance certificate and share it with you ahead of the meet.

Is there a spreadsheet for competitions in the 2024-25 season, or any other way to get information about upcoming events besides Hokie Classic? The spreadsheet for this year's non-sanctioned events will be on the [website](#) in the next few days. Here is a direct link to the [spreadsheet](#).

Is there any cost to organizations to sanction an event? Nope!

When you sanction a meet how many free medals are given? 3 per level per event

Will you go into more detail on the event sanctioning process? You can request a sanction for your event [here](#). The sanctioning team then evaluates the request to confirm that the event follows all NAIGC rules/regulations and aligns with our goals for maximizing inclusivity! if you have more questions please email us sanctioning@naigc.org. Once your sanction request is approved, you are assigned a rep on the sanctioning team who helps you step by step through the event hosting process. The goal is to support you if you are unfamiliar with hosting your own event, but not to stand in your way if you are already a seasoned pro!

What is the process for bidding to host your regional competition/when does it start? You can submit your bid [here](#). The form is open now, and all bids are due by October 15, 2024.

Regarding the minimum requirements for levels hosted to be awarded a sanction, what are the kinds of situations which would be considered for an exception? If you are able to host all WAG levels but your gym does not/cannot have MAG equipment, or vice versa.

Is there anything being done to help get ALL meets listed on the spreadsheet? It felt like a lot of meets didn't get listed last year? No, we are not actively doing anything to get more unsanctioned events on this spreadsheet. It is editable by the public and intended for folks to use if they want, but our priority at this time is supporting sanctioned events!



Nationals Questions

At nationals this year, would volunteering for tear down still be required or will it still be volunteering as it was prior to last year? We ask that everyone in the gym for finals stays for 15-20 minutes to help take apart the event they're on. We will also be looking for volunteers willing to stay longer to get everything packed up and put on trucks! Volunteers that stay later (as well as volunteers that help with set up and score entry during the event) will get some extra merch perks this year!

How do you qualify for nationals? Nationals is open to everyone! You just need to register online.

Is nationals registration fee expected to be the same as last year? Yes! Fees are not changing.



Misc. Questions

Is it possible to get granted non-profit status from NAIGC? Unfortunately, we are not able to do this at this time. We are looking into expanding our insurance offerings to be able to provide general liability insurance for clubs (outside of just day-of sanction meet insurance), but we don't have that service available yet.

How do you recommend opening bank accounts for clubs? The NAIGC uses First Internet Bank, which has low fees and a relatively easy process for adding and removing account signatories as organization leadership changes. To make doing things like this easier, we are looking into options for community clubs to be granted 501(c)3 status as subordinates under the NAIGC's tax exemption, but we don't have that service available yet.

Can people compete both mag and wag? Yes, you can compete as many disciplines (MAG/WAG/T&T) as you want and there is no additional fee at Nationals.

Are you able to compete in certain events, or do we have to compete in every event? Gymnasts are allowed to compete whichever events they wish, with no minimum or maximum requirements.

Have you considered mix-matching levels, just not allowing an AA score then? Yes it has been discussed, but at this time is is logistically not possible to implement. The open level will also be more flexible when it comes to skill level variation between events.

Is NAIGC in conversation with any of our sponsors/partners on size and gender inclusive merch/uniform options? We reach out to a wide-variety of sponsors/vendors each year in hopes of providing a range of diverse products and services that align with the NAIGC's core values. We can certainly be on the lookout this year specifically for size and gender inclusive merch/uniform options.
